

SCHOLARSHIP LISTING #1 – Revised

APPLICANTS: **Read qualifying materials carefully to make sure all criteria is met.** You'll need to have applied for post-secondary training, at Colleges, Universities or Tech schools/Training programs [**aim for completion by Thanksgiving**].

You will be asked to provide the following:

- An acceptance letter from post-secondary institution.
- ACT score report, where applicable.
- CACC Supplemental Financial Statement for some Center scholarships.
- FAFSA application **MUST** be filed by March 1, 2010. (You can register to get your pin number @ www.fafsa.ed.gov prior to filing).

AMERICAN WELDING SOCIETY FOUNDATION:

Several scholarship opportunities for students who intend to pursue a college course in Welding, Engineering or Welding Engineering Technology. There is one district level scholarship available and 16 National level scholarships! All National scholarships have their own unique applications. ANN ARBOR GRAPHICS:

Scholarships are available for students pursuing full time study in graphic communications course of study at an accredited two or four year college or university, leading to an associate or bachelors degree recognized by the graphic communications industries. Awards are for at least \$1,500 and may be renewable. Applications are due March 1, 2010 and are available online at <http://www.print.org/Careers.cfm> [scroll down through a lot of information to Michigan scholarships...it's linked to the website]

BATTLE CREEK COMMUNITY FOUNDATION:

The application, for more than 175 scholarships, for the 2010-11 school year will be available online at www.bccfoundation.org beginning Jan 1, 2010.

Both the BCCF applications, and *a copy of the FASFA* will be due at their office March 1, 2010 (deadlines in your sending high school guidance office will be earlier - check with your own high school. Counselors check applications for completeness and they deliver them in a packet to the Foundation.

Original FASFA must be received by March 1, 2010. **Filing online?** It's the preferred method. **TIP: When you submit your FAFSA, be sure to print out the confirmation page and keep it for your records. It contains a confirmation number with the exact date and time (Central Standard Time) the form was received.**

BLANCH BARR-TRONE: Eligible students are those who attend one of the following Battle Creek area schools: Battle Creek Central, Bellevue, Harper Creek, Lakeview, Marshall, Pennfield or St. Philip. Students should be pursuing further education in the medical fields of **pharmacy or nursing**. Applications **MUST** be complete with all required information or it will not be reviewed. **DEADLINE: March 1, 2010.**

CALHOUN AREA ASSOCIATION FOR COUNSELING & DEVELOPMENT:

Awarded through this organization to a graduating senior attending a post-secondary institution. Must have financial need. Deadline will be noted on a future posting once S & C S receives the applications.

KCC GOLD KEY

This scholarship is for current high school seniors planning to attend KCC full time next year. The required GPA is 3.2 with and ACT score of 20 or higher. Financial need is not a criterion. The Gold Key provides \$2,500.00 annually for two years, with an additional \$1,000.00 available for continued education after completion of a two-year degree.

Awards will be made to freshmen showing superior academic promise and leadership potential. The application process is lengthy and must be received **by the Kellogg Community College Foundation by the Actual Deadline: January 15, 2010.**

KELLOGG COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOUNDATION

KCC has *many* other scholarships available through the Kellogg Community College Foundation. Check in Student & Career Services for more information, or go online to www.kellogg.edu/foundation (Minimum GPA for most KCC Foundation scholarships is 2.5) **These *need based scholarship applications* are due from Jan. 15, 2010 – March 1, 2010...check EACH scholarship deadline carefully.**

KELLOGG COMPANY CAREERS SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students working toward an associate's degree in accounting, business management or human resources management. Up to \$3,000 annually for two years while attending KCC and includes a paid internship at the Kellogg Company World Headquarters. **Applications Deadline: February 15, 2010.**

McCURDY SCOFIELD SCHOLARSHIP: Eligible students include seniors of private and public schools who reside in Calhoun County and are seeking educational opportunities in an accredited college or university and plan to attend as a full time student. Requirements include leadership, citizenship, work ethic, community service and financial need. **This is a renewable scholarship. \$1,500 for McCurdy and \$700 for Scofield. Applications are in late March. Actual Deadline: **TBD and must include transcripts and ACT scores.****

NATIONAL MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS SOCIETY:

Michigan high school seniors who have multiple sclerosis (MS), or a parent with MS are eligible to apply. Applicants must also plan to attend an accredited post secondary school for the first time. This annual scholarship program opens October 1, 2009 and ends in January 2010.
