- **Reinforcing effort and providing recognition**

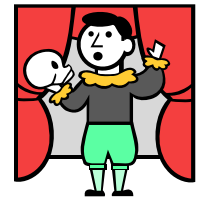


- **Homework and practice**

- Asking students to
  - Generate mental images.
  - Draw pictures or pictographs.
  - Construct graphic organizers.
  - Act out.
  - Make physical models of content.

- **Setting objectives and providing feedback**



- **Generating and testing hypotheses**

- Engaging students in projects that involve generating and testing hypotheses through
  - Problem solving tasks
  - Decision making tasks
  - Investigation tasks
  - Experimental inquiry tasks
  - Systems analysis tasks
  - Invention tasks



- **Questions, cues and advance organizers**

- Prior to presenting new content:
  - Asking students to recall what they already know about it
  - Providing students with direct links to what they have studied previously
  - Providing ways for students to organize or think about content
