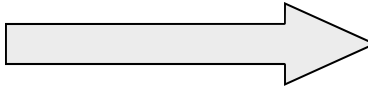


Michigan Works! Battle Creek Service Center Customer Flow Chart

Representative answers general questions and directs job seeker customers to JET Program or Employer customers to Business Services.

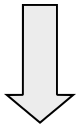
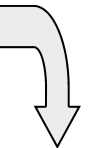


Business Services

A partnership between business, workforce development, educators, and economic developers to help businesses to be successful and to meet their demands for skilled workers.

Jobs, Education & Training (JET)

JET assists participants referred from DHS. JET offers job search assistance, employment related supportive services and/or training and educational opportunities.

- Attend orientation or meet with case manager
- Access to Food Assistance Program

Michigan Prisoner Re-Entry Program (MPRI)

Parolees who are able to participate in the MPRI Program are determined by the MDOC Parole Board prior to their release. MPRI staff assists these individuals in making the transition from prison back into the community by providing them with:

- Workforce development services
- Life skills training
- Supportive services

Trade Adjustment Assistance Program (TAA)

TAA staff assists individuals who have become unemployed as a result of increased imports from or shifts in production to foreign countries. Individuals may receive occupational re-training if approval criteria is met.

Intensive Training Services/No Worker Left Behind

W.I.A. Adult and Dislocated Worker Program staff assists eligible customers with job search assistance and training opportunities.

W.I.A. Youth Program

Serves youth between the ages of 16-21 who meet eligibility requirements **Refer youth to Goodwill Industries, 4820 Wayne Rd., Battle Creek, 269-964-9455, ext. 229.**

Veterans Services

Veterans Employment Specialist meets with customers to discuss services available to veterans.

Michigan Rehabilitation Services

MRS Counselor meets with individuals with disabilities to discuss job search and/or training.

American Association of Retired Persons (AARP)

Assists low income individuals age 55 and older in finding employment. Each participant will participate in a work training program for 18 hours per week until they obtain employment.
